STIPEND FOR TRAINING PERIOD

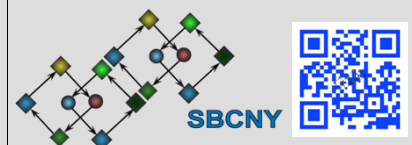
- \$4,000 stipend
